
We had 8 online meeting before the gathering with the team also personal meeting with the university staff and with the leader of the dormitory and the restaurant we had dinner with all participant.

The second Women's Meeting was held at the Central European University in Budapest. The venue and topics were chosen through online meetings. The number and composition of participants varied. The main reason for this continues to be COVID-19 and of course the need to earn a living and season summer work. No matter how hard we tried to choose the best time, there was always something that made some participants unable to attend.

We tried to invite and address women with few opportunity to express their views on public issues. They chose a very important topic and it was very important that they were heard and that their message was passed. Our topic was the impact of the war in Ukraine and its consequences on our daily lives and access to services.

Role models:







Imola Rubina Malek: is 28 years old and graduated from the Corvinus University of Budapest with a Master's degree in Business Development. She was introduced to the other participants because of her background and success in school. Imola is being raised by her mother alone with her brother. Because of their financial situation, she wanted to leave high school and go to work to help her mother and brother. Fortunately, she met young people from Amrita who helped her find a free personal teacher and scholarship support for her studies.

Bogdán Klaudia: Klaudia has come from difficult circumstances to work as an International Relations Department Assistant. She graduated from Ambedkar School, worked in a hair salon and a restaurant before that. She was invited to talk about her current work, the importance of learning the language and the difficulties she experienced as a child in the institution.

Boda Laura: Laura is a senior student at an Italian-language high school who has applied to study communication at the University of Budapest. Laura is a role model for girls who want to continue their studies. During the talks, she managed to convince mothers that girls should be allowed to go to other cities or even countries to study for a better future.

Wenzcler Ibolya: Ibolya is the mother of four children and an active participant in our project. She is enthusiastic about working on NCC tasks and formulating proposals with us. She has played an important role in the discussions as she was the example who discouraged girls from choosing early childbearing instead of school. At the same time, she showed that even if it happens, you can still come back to the community and talk about important things and make suggestions for those who can make a difference.

Boda Péterné: Zsuzsi represented the role of an ordinary mother, talking about the difficulties a woman has to face in raising a family without proper education. She presented a list of training courses that she had completed through the employment centers with very good results and still had not managed to get a job in any of the positions. He made suggestions that job centers should not only train people, but also create jobs after the training.

Leadership capacity of the organization in charge of co-implementing the activity:

5 core people including our NCC member, we have long common experiments working together and knowing the community very well. The locality of the staff helps us to have cover the work need it for the preparation face and implementation.

They play active role on helping to find participant after some stepping back, because of Covid and expresses. Logistical implementation of the program, making videos and images. They were actively involved in organizing the participants' travel, accommodation and administration

Engagement of key stakeholders:



Our invited guest was the student coordinator of Romaversitas, who is help the students to choose the right school during the summer camp. Hes task was to explain the further education opportunities and conditions available in Budapest. He also shared information and services to help the girls who have been accepted into the schools to successfully complete their studies.

We also invited speakers from the CEU faculty and from Ukraine who, due to the summer break or illness, cancelled their attendance at the meeting.

During the meeting, we presented the whole project to the participants and CEU s staff during the planning phase, also by e-mail. We made backpacks with the project logo and pens and flyers that were distributed during the meeting.

The impact of the Ukrainian War on our everyday life







In Hungary, the situation of the poor has always been more neglected than in other EU countries, especially nowadays because of the current crisis situation, where food prices are rising week by week, people have lost their jobs or have incomes so low that they cannot afford even basic food.



They have no money left to pay their utility bills, or to maintain their homes, so the increased utility bills have completely impoverished people who previously had no problem.

Those living below the minimum subsistence level (80% of the Roma population) are starving, sick and waiting for the winter in unheated and unpowered homes.

Public assistance, job creation is lagging behind, while inflation in Hungary has reached 40-60% (Food 35.2%, Household energy, heating 62.1%)

Suggestions for solutions:







"I feel very comfortable at the meetings organised by Amrita because I feel like we are talking about the problem and doing something about it. What would make the meetings more effective, in my opinion, would be to invite more experts who have a better insight into these issues, for example from a ministry or a sympathetic political party.

Proposals to the government (with plenty of EU funding this could be done):

- put a limit on food growth
- raise the limits on the amount of electricity (210) and gas (140)
- set a time limit for these laws e.g. reducing overheads to 2023.
- Exempting people living below the minimum per capita of 1 from this law
- Instead of building a stadium, create facilities that create declared jobs for the underprivileged

Proposals to the Amrita OBK Association:

Conduct surveys and statistics on the extent to which people in our country are affected by the crisis, e.g. how
many people cannot afford to pay their utility bills and therefore turn off their heating and cook and bathe less (or

do not cook and bathe with running water but only in lavor), switch to a filling solution, how many people become unemployed, how many small businesses go bankrupt, how many people become homeless. Submitting the above proposals to the government backed up by these statistics.

Please, explain in detail the main conclusions of the event, and those remarks that will be disseminated among stakeholders regarding"

"My name is Irma Horváthová, a married middle-aged gypsy woman with 4 children, who stands by her principles and who hopes that one day the gypsy people will be accepted as a people of the nation, not just as a minority group. I fight against stereotyping and oppression."

Responsibilities towards the state: housing, health, education and employment.

Build terraced houses for disadvantaged families with Eus funding, with electricity, water, bathrooms where children can sit down, do their homework, where the family can sit at a table and have lunch. Build community centres where young people can come together to reduce crime, have tutors and mentors in the community centres to help young people with homework, organise free thinking sessions etc. Organise sessions for parents on how to deal with teenagers so that parents can make their children feel that they are important to them.

Also with EU funding, build factories where the analphabet people can get jobs to support their families decently, get decent wages so they don't need to rely on state aid, so they can avoid hunger, burglary, theft, truancy, because they would have money to buy clothes, shoes, food and buy medicines.

Some medicines, which are mainly antibiotics, could be the least expensive. This way the parent could also redeem the medicine sooner rather than waiting for the aid to arrive and then redeem it.

The training was very good full of good information and small games. What she missed was that there was not enough time to break down some of the topics and that there were not enough young girls (16-18). And could grandmothers be involved who are more experienced and could one person from each sphere be invited (a nurse, a family worker, a teacher, a police officer etc.)"

"Wenczler Ibolya I am 35 years old

I am currently a full-time mother of 4 children.

Suggestions: to carry out a regional survey of qualifications and previous work experience, with the involvement of local government and employment centres, to set up direct courses and job creation, possibly including a monthly allowance, to help participants to find work in the area after completing the training and course education Restoring compulsory schooling to 18 years of age

Assessment of the level of knowledge and lesson plan according to this assessment free language courses for interested students organizing more public conferences in the area concerned. compiling an informative printed booklet looking for partners or working with NGOs actually building a network I think to get a real picture of the country

"I am Péterné Boda. I live in Mánfa. I am married with two children. I am currently unemployed.

To this day I try to do everything I can to find work more easily. I am taking training courses, such as:

In 1996 a training as a Social Assistant, in 2017 a training as a Nursery Nurse, in July this year a training as a Shop Assistant and Commercial Sales.

I see the easiest way to make a living in life is to learn, and that if you do one training course, it may be easier to get from one to the other, which unfortunately is not quite the case nowadays.

There are many problems that people face and I and my family feel this very much in everyday life.

One such is medical care, which is unfortunately a disaster in this country. Whatever tests you want, you have to wait months for an appointment. The rise in food prices, which already far exceeds Western prices, and, at the same time, salaries here are a disaster. The job situation, which has not been easy, with the rise in gas and electricity and fuel, is the reason given by all employers for not considering new staff, who would be happy not to have to lay off existing staff. There are a number of areas that need big big changes in my opinion. Such as: Quality education for our children, Patient care, Providing jobs for those who want them.

Salaries, and I don't mean millions, just enough so that you don't have a problem paying your rent every day. to give their families what they need (fruit, vegetables, clothing...)

And the humanity, the empathy, which has been lost in this difficult situation, would return.

These programs that I participated in this summer are very important. Roma women come together from all over the country, they live in different situations, and yet our lives intersect at many points.

Talking together about everyday problems, finding out their remedies, talking, reconnecting a little bit. Being a little bit liberated again. That is why I find these meetings important and valuable."
